Lt Col Donald Gara served as the Lone Eagle Composite Squadron Commander for about three years until December of 2002. He had several essays published in the book, *Cavalry of the American Revolution*, edited by Jim Picuch. The essays discuss cavalry raids in New York and New Jersey in 1780 and 1781 which haven't received much attention in American Revolutionary War histories as they were considered too minor. Lt Col Donald Gara is still a senior member of this squadron although he retired to Florida a number of years ago.

Jim Picuch, editor of *Cavalry of the American Revolution*, is an associate professor of history at Kennesaw State University in Georgia. He received his doctorate in history from the College of William & Mary and is author of a number of books, including *The Battle of Camden: A Documentary History*. The cavalry book is available on Amazon or can be borrowed soon from the Morris County Library.
